Confirmation of Previous Minutes:

The previous minutes were moved by Allan House and seconded by Robert Young.

Business Arising:

- Margaret MacDonald-Hill: The Waratah Rivulet inspection was conducted a date for the underground tour is yet to be set.
- Margaret MacDonald-Hill: Gary Eastement has had to resign from the CCC due to his relocation to another region.
- Robert Scullion: Regarding the power upgrade review of environmental factors, how will
 the sale of Integral Energy affect this project, and is the approval by integral likely to be in
 December according to the schedule?
- Jon Degotardi / Peter Baker: We are unsure as to how or if the sale will have any impact. It
 is likely to be in January.
- Allan House: Have there been any further discussions with Apex Energy regarding their coal seem gas project?
- Peter Baker: There have been no further discussions with Apex Energy. We note that Apex Energy's project was featured in a number of articles in the latest edition of the Helensburgh and District News and that Peabody Metropolitan Coal was not mentioned in these articles. It appears as though the separation between the two companies is now better understood. At the request of Otford Protection Society we searched publically available sources (the Internet) for the Apex Energy Environmental Assessment. This information was located and subsequently provided to the Otford Protection Society.
- Allan House: Is it possible to obtain a map showing Metropolitan Coal's landownership at the next CCC meeting?
- **Action:** a map showing landownership and land to which the Colliery has surface rights will be provided at the next CCC meeting.

Action Items from Previous CCC Meeting:

All actions from the previous meeting were carried out:

- The REF study for the Integral Energy power supply upgrade to be made available to CCC members once complete – the REF study was emailed to CCC members.
- A copy of the timeline for the various project expansion activities is to be sent to all CCC members – the timeline was distributed and it was also included in CCC presentation provided by Metropolitan Coal personnel.
- The CCC requested regular updates concerning the Apex Coal Seam Gas proposal an update was provided by Peter Baker during Business Arising.
- It was suggested that photos and a profile of the CCC members should be included in the next community newsletter – a profile and photo has been included in the next edition which is due for distribution in January 2011.
- A meeting will be held between Allan House and Metropolitan Coal to further discuss matters concerning the heritage railway tunnel the meeting was organised and an inspection was conducted by Ryan Pascoe. A future meeting is required to discuss this matter in greater detail.

Peter Baker: it is possible that some stages of the MEXP will result in elevated noise levels. The operation will monitor this and will endeavour to minimise noise affects. Wherever possible community members will be informed concerning activities which have potential off-site consequences.

General Business:

Patricia Gauci: it has been remarked that there is evidence of a breast cancer cluster in Helensburgh.

Action: Metropolitan Coal to research this issue and provide to the CCC any relevant data. Ryan Pascoe: as discussed at previous CCC meetings, Helensburgh has relatively low dust levels. Nevertheless we will conduct an investigation to see what information is available concerning this issue.

Action: Ryan Pascoe to review TEOM monitoring data and provide the CCC with information about dust levels in Helensburgh.

Amanda Reilly: I was wondering whether the mine rendered any assistance with respect to the Pike River disaster and if there is anything we can do as a CCC to assist?

Peter Baker: a number of Mine's Rescue Teams were sent from Australia to assist where possible.

Action: Peter Baker to provide information on if / how the CCC can assist.
