#### **Pollution Reduction Program**

PAE Holmes commissioned to Audit activities.

- Initial site visit in December 2011 & desktop analysis and follow up site visit in May 2012.
- Initial findings show Top 4 dust producing activities as:
  - Hauling on unsealed roads

- Wind erosion of active coal stockpiles
- Loading and unloading of coal
- Wind erosion of exposed areas and overburden.
- Audit to be submitted by 29th June 2012

#### Reverse Osmosis Plant

Water quality for first six months of operation:

- EC =/< 1500µS/cm, monitored continuously;</li>
- pH = between 6.5 8.5, monitored continuously;
- TSS =/< 50mg/L, monitored with a grab sample;</li>
- Oil & Grease =/<10gm/L monitored with a grab sample; and</li>
- Discharge of no more than 5ML/day to Wilpinjong Creek.
- Long Term water quality changes:
  - $\circ$  EC =/< 500 $\mu$ S/cm,
  - Discharge at a flow regime that is variable and consistent with the ephemeral nature of the flows in Wilpinjong and Cumbo Creeks
- Commenced discharge 20th June 2012 & to midday Friday Wilpinjong had discharged 7.2ML

Water sampling occurs downstream of Reverse Osmosis Plant on a monthly basis;

BH – Discharges from Wilpinjong, Moolarben and Ulan to Goulburn river. Rivers flood and dissipates very quickly and will impact on rivers Wilpinjong, Cumbo and Goulburn;

2014 – If WCPL becomes low in water, may need to construct a pipe line from Moolarben and Ulan, endeavor to be self-efficient and hold water in storage. Recycling water would better option for the mine.

#### 5 Year Mine Plan

- Pit 5 expand out to West, North & South of the mine, Pit 2 moving towards the south
- Pit 1- Largely on hold

- 1. EM Reported rumours received of reopening train line from Lue to Kandos and mines using the line and to by-pass Mudgee;
- KB Purchased a fire truck from the Lawson Fire Brigade, carries 2K litres of water. RFS from Mudgee and WCPL employees are trained to operate;
